



In 2003 John Edmonson wrote that he might prepare a toast to our class for the 40th reunion that went like this:


Here's wishing you've been more healthy than sick; that you've done more living than seen dying; that you've succeeded more often than you've failed; that you've been in love a very long time.

I remember being in the car with Steve Goza and Jimmy Joseph. We had just thrown out some firecrackers near the Alcoa bridge that always gets painted. We were pulled over by the Alcoa police. Steve was driving and told the policeman that he was from Veracruz, Mexico (his father was plant manager at an Alcoa plant there). I just knew we were going to be in trouble. Would you believe none of the firecrackers ever went off?

Another time during lunch period I was outside Miss Haddox's classroom with some other folks. This was my sophomore year. A junior (who will remain nameless) tried to throw part of an ice cream sandwich over the transom into her room. The missile hit the transom window and started dripping into the room. Of course we flushed like a covey of quail. Later on I found out that someone rousted my innocent brother Johnny who was a senior and was working in the lunchroom at the time of the incident. Apparently they heard the name Redwine and assumed he was in on it. I never heard anything else about it.

During one of my high school years I was a manager for the football team along with Phil Mizell. One day while we were lining off the field for the night's home game, we got the really smart idea to write Don Rawls' name on the grassy bank that went up toward the old gym. We wrote it in letters about 10 feet high. For some reason Coach Rawls did not see any humor in this. He gave us a deadline to have that name removed prior to the game. Believe me it was easier to put on than it was to take off.

I remember in junior English finally getting an A from Mrs. Cate for one six week grading period. I may have been prouder of that than any other grade I ever received.

One Halloween some group of folks rolled Mrs. Beech's yard. She was extremely bothered by that and was never the same after that incident. She took that very personally. I was not in on that escapade.

In senior English, Mrs. Cole required everyone to give a speech in front of the class. When it was Bill Beaty's turn, he got tickled and started laughing. He must have tried four or five times to re-start his speech with the same result. I don't think he ever gave his speech. The fact that Butch McDade's smiling face was on the front row I think heavily contributed to Bill's laughter. Of course at some point the entire class was laughing, including Mrs. Cole.

One year we had Mr. Roy Roberts for math in the period prior to lunch. There were other classes that got out of class for lunch at the same time. Over time there developed a competition to see who could get to the lunchroom first. I remember one nice warm day, the bell rang for lunch and Mr. Roberts was not in the class. I have never seen anything like it. Guys in my class were climbing out the windows and running down the sidewalk and coming back in the doors along Lawrence Street. It was like a jail break. I was laughing so hard I could hardly eat lunch. Someone did explain to the class that this behavior should not occur in the future. I actually think that Butch McDade was the ringleader. I know he used to lead a rhythm band in that same class. Mr. Roberts would leave and Butch would start rapping on his desk. This would start others doing it. It would get loud and out of control. I guess Butch was always a drummer at heart.

I remember the fast rides to Zesto with Glenn Loveday and others to get hotdogs at lunch.

I remember the time the Hord brothers walked by Mrs. Cole's room's windows. One was on the shoulders of the other, but it looked like the top one was walking by. It was probably 6 or 7 feet from the bottom of the window to the sidewalk. As a result you never saw anyone walk by. That broke up the class.

I learned a really good lesson in Mr. Watson's biology class. I got back a test paper, and it was marked 99. The question I missed asked for three things – I had provided four answers – three correct ones and one incorrect one. I went to the front of the room and pointed this out to Mr. Watson. I said "but I have three correct answers and you just asked for three". Mr. Watson said "but one of your answers is wrong". We went back and forth until I made the mistake of saying "but you can't do that." He looked at me, grinned, and took his pencil and marked out the 99. He wrote in 97. He then said "what do you think now?" I went back to my seat a little wiser.




